Member Spotlight: Meet Kathy Black Judy Houston

When she moved to Venice in 2009, Kathy Black



was an AAUW member in her home state of New York. She noticed an announcement from the Venice chapter and brought herself to a meeting. It didn't take long to recognize her

organizational talents. For seven years, from 2010 to 2016, she co-chaired the Venice chapter's annual home tour, which underwrites re-entry scholarships. She's quick to share the credit for this successful fundraiser. "It takes more than a hundred volunteers to staff these homes, not to mention additional people to manage parking."

What does it take for a home to land a spot on our AAUW home tour? She laughs, "Basically someone willing to let 1,000 people to come through their home on a single day." One of the perks of heading up this project is "meeting the homeowners ahead of time, finding out what makes them passionate about their homes." She notes that one of last year's homeowners was Beverly Weltzien, who went on to become an AAUW member and, with Jan Harris, is now cochair of the 2017 home tour. About that, she says, "I'm thrilled that it is in good hands with Bev and Ian."

For two years, from 2013 to 2015, Kathy wore two hats, the second as the chapter's president. While she has stepped down from these roles, she's still very active. She has taken on the role of chapter historian and is very involved in the outdoor adventure group. She recommends that new members get involved in these interest groups. "It's where you meet likeminded women who can become lifelong friends."

A graduate of the State University College at Buffalo, she has a degree in Family and Consumer Education, a discipline which grew out of what was called home economics in the past. It encompasses culinary skills, clothing design, financial/consumer education and child development. She taught both at the middle and high school levels, primarily in Corinth, a town in the foothills of the New York Adirondacks.

Husband Steve, also an educator, was a principal, and the couple moved several times because of his career changes. "We even moved to Key West, Florida, once," she laughs. That move came during a very cold winter in upstate New York when they sent resumes to "anyplace we could think of that was warm." Key West

responded and they moved there for a year but left because Steve's focus was elementary level education, which meant a move back to New York State.

Aside from teaching, Kathy's passions are fashion design and architecture and interior design. She says she inherited her love of sewing from her mother and grandmother and has made at least 50 wedding dresses. She and her husband are currently updating a home in Sorrento Woods in Nokomis.

Kathy's has two daughters, one a lawyer for the Food and Drug Administration in Washington, D.C. and the other completing a Ph.D. in volcanology, a subset of geology, in Colorado. "I'm thrilled that I raised two wonderful women who share my support of the AAUW message of equality, philanthropy and advocacy for women and girls."
