They would strengthen the existing equal pay statute by prohibiting screening of job applicants based on prior wages and retaliation against employees who discuss wages. Venice Branch Endowed Funds for Womens' Graduate Education

Francis T. Bourne Research and Projects Grant. In 1996, the Branch members raised \$33,000 to endow a national career development grant in the name of Francis T. Bourne, one of our members, for which the Jacaranda Library is named. She worked tirelessly to get that Library built for South County residents.

Natasha Thomas is the 2016-17 recipient of that Grant, the 11th woman to be honored with this award. An English language arts teacher for nearly a decade, Natasha Thomas aims to arm students with critical learning skills that will empower them to become discerning readers and skilled leaders. She is pursuing a master's in literacy education at University of Florida, Gainesville, FL. Prior to teaching, the happily married mother of three served as a journalist for Tribune-owned media, as well as a marketing and public relations expert with heath-based organizations.

American Fellowship Fund. In 2013, additional funds provided by deceased members allowed the Branch to initially fund a national endowment for graduate education for women. The goal is to raise \$200,000 in 15 years to fully fund the endowment in perpetuity.

The Fund balance is currently \$62,633 and reaching our goal of \$200,000 by 2028 requires member donations and an annual addition of Branch funds raised by the Home Tour and other means.

Branch members are encouraged to donate to the American Fellowship Fund by sending a check with a note in the memo line of Fund #4390. In 2016, total donations by members to this Fund was \$600. In 2017, we can certainly surpass that amount.




