TECH TREK

What do DNA, robots, Cyber Security, and APPs have in common? They were all experienced by 12 year-old Florida girls at AAUW Tech Trek Camp. The Camp was held at Palm Beach State College and Florida Atlantic University from June 12th through June18th.

Our Venice branch sponsored 6 girls who attended Tech Trek after an extensive selection process. In Venice we began the process in November by contacting all area schools with 7th grade students. Seven schools nominated a total of 22 girls, 14 girls submitted applications. In March, our members, Penny Nuttleman, Jean Norman, Carol Cudia and Jean Moorehead interviewed and ranked the 14 applicants. The Florida Tech Trek State committee pared that number to 6 girls.

At our monthly meeting on October 13th, those 6 girls will share some of their experiences at Tech Trek. They are: Madison Campbell and Emily Burch of Imagine School North Port, Kylie Raybourn of SKY Academy, Talon Bottonfield and Quinn DuBre of Venice Middle School and Autymn Edwards of Venice Christian Academy.

We recently received a letter from Michelle Sooklal, Assistant Principal at SKY Academy recounting some of her student's experiences praising our Tech Trek Camp. She wrote, "She was thrilled with what she learned and experienced She loved every part of it from her workshops and classes to staying in the college dorms. She loved her cyber security and edible science."

We at Venice AAUW can feel very proud of our efforts to encourage girls in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. We are demonstrating that girls can do anything.


