

MEET BETH GAMEL

Beth is a native Michigander who also pursued her education in state, graduating from Michigan State University with a degree in elementary education and science. Wanting to try something new, she moved to San Diego, California to teach. "It seemed like a bit of an adventure," she says.

Life got a little more adventurous when she met the man who became her husband, who was from Alaska. She moved to Anchorage with him when they married in 1965. Alaska is still where she calls home, snowbirding in Venice from the end of October through the end of April.

After the birth of the first of three daughters, she became involved in community education in Anchorage and was in charge of the program. "Big job, no pay," she comments. She and a friend also launched a pre-school program there because all of the existing ones were full. "I'm very proud that it's still going," she says.

She's taught all grades from first through seventh including special education. In addition to positions in Anchorage schools, she's also taught in Sarasota and Venice, where the family lived when her mother retired here.

While she lived in Venice, the family did a lot of biking. She spent six years on the Venice Parks Board and originated the first bicycle trail along the Intracoastal Waterway, working with the Army Corps of Engineers to realize her vision. "It didn't get built until we were back in Alaska," she says, "but it was a wonderful thing for the community, a way to get to the beach without cycling in traffic."

Boating is another avocation. She and her husband were the first recreational sailors in Resurrection Bay, Alaska. Another first for them was a voyage from Tacoma, Washington, to Seward, Alaska, with a nine-month and four-year old on board. While they lived full-time in Venice, the couple bought a 40-foot sailboat and sailed it in the Caribbean.

Beth is also the second half of a sister act with Trena Kelly, persuaded by her to join AAUW eight years ago. The two headed the Special Interest Groups (SIG) for two years. She encourages other members to "get involved with one or more of the small groups." Through SIG, she says she has met "many lovely women and done so many fun things."

Like many members, she is a big supporter of women's equity. "Both my sister and I love the Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) and believe in what it does."
