Venice AAUW General Meeting on November 8, 2018

The meeting was held at the Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Venice.

The Program was presented by Pat Weber, Education chair. Three of the girls who went to Tech Trek camp this past summer spoke on their experience. Pat Weber spoke on the STEM and STEAM programs that AAUW Venice provides. Jami Naylor, of Jacaranda Branch Library demonstrated some of the technology used at the STEM event AAUW sponsored with the library, as well as at the library's own teen events.

President Kathleen Pickering called the meeting to order at 12:50 PM

The minutes were approved as posted in Venice Views.

Fran Potter reported there is a balance of \$17,900.42. A savings account was opened. It will provide a small amount of interest, but help keep contributions separate from operating expense money, as required by state law.

Lydia Russo was introduced as the new Hospitality Chair.

Pam Cox will help with the MonkeySurvey, to evaluate how the branch is doing.

LAF was explained for those who might not have been familiar and a volunteer was asked for, to help better publicize and promote LAF.

The nominating committee was announced: Suzanne Biviano, chair; Judy Houston; Dottie Bingham; Fran Brinkman; Bev Weltzien. The positions of President, Membership and Secretary will be selected. Members who are interested in running for state office were encouraged to contact Mimi Welch.

Carol Carlson introduced new members and guests.

Bev Weltzien spoke on Development. A potential budget was presented - see addendum. A survey on funding was distributed, gauging what events and methods of fund-raising members preferred and were willing to participate in.

Paula Dulski explained the skills list she is developing. The chapter has great need of a person familiar with parliamentary procedure to succeed Mimi Welch, who will retire after many years of providing this service to our branch.

Suzi Barbee spoke on the Home Tour's need for volunteers for all positions. Sign-up sheets were provided.

Fran Potter spoke on the use of credit cards for the Home Tour, and, eventually, branch events. There will be training for ticket sellers. A small transaction fee will be charged, so the credit card use will be revenue neutral. Refunds will be provided for branch events if requested at least 10 days before the event.

Open Mike produced the comment to create fund-raising using the community vs. just members.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:20 PM.

Member Profile

Barbara Stevens



You may only know her as a serious bridge player but she's also been one of AAUW's leading ladies, having served as branch president from 2001 to 2005.

Originally from Chicago, she graduated from Drake University in Ames, Iowa, with a degree in elementary education. Marriage took her to Pennsylvania where her new husband was in graduate school. Once she had children, she continued working as a substitute teacher.

A move to Long Island, New York, prompted her to return to school. She completed her graduate work at Long Island University, earning a master's degree in library science. Her new credentials took her to the Great Neck library system where she worked for 16 years until she retired. She says, "I worked in most departments, everything from media to reference."

She was an AAUW member while on Long Island but "I really couldn't participate much due to working."

Relocating to Florida, she says, "was the best move of my life." She joined the Venice branch soon after landing here in 1997. She encourages new AAUW members to participate. "The best thing you can do for yourself is get involved. I really don't know how someone can join and not participate."

In her case, she took on a board position as secretary. "And then, when the nominating committee had a hard time finding someone to run for president, she took that on. "I guess I stepped up," she says.

The branch Home Tour began while she was president. An early project in the STEM area also took place during her tenure. "It was a Jeopardy-like competition at the elementary school level," she explains.

After completing two terms as Venice branch president, she went on to a term as AAUW Florida State president from 2008 to 2010.

These days, she's playing bridge but to say that is "an understatement." She also started the duplicate bridge group at this branch. In addition to playing, she teaches AAUW duplicate players once a month.

Cook's Corner and Play Readers are two special interest groups (SIG) she currently attends. "I've enjoyed every moment I have been an AAUW member," she explains, "and I expect to continue to make the most of my membership."

Finance Director Update

Fran Potter

An update on actions taken by the Board at the November meeting:

Credit Card Capability - To increase our revenue opportunities for the Home Tour, we are acquiring the capability to accept credit cards using Square for selling home tour gift certificates at the Holiday Party, tickets at the Farmer's Market (in advance of Home Tour) and at the homes on the day of the Tour. We may also use this capability to offer members the convenience of using credit cards to pay for tickets to future branch events. In all cases a transaction fee will be added to the amount charged to pay for processing fees.

Member Event Refunds – Occasionally a member buys a ticket to a member event (Holiday Party or Scholarship Luncheon) well in advance and then something comes up which will prevent her from attending. When this happens, members have generally considered the cost of the unused ticket to be a donation with no expectation of refund. While this donation is certainly appreciated, the Board recognizes some members may wish to get a refund for a ticket they cannot use. To address this situation, the Board voted to provide a refund for member events (Holiday Party or Scholarship Luncheon) if requested more than 10 days prior to the event. (This does not apply to tickets for fundraising events such as Home Tour tickets.)
