MEMBER SPOTLIGHT BOBBI AMERO

The branch's new finance director didn't start out to be a numbers person. When this New Hampshire native graduated with a degree in sociology (minor in psychology), she found a bleak job market for social workers.

She found a position with Liberty Mutual Insurance, a berth she thought might be temporary until things changed in her field. Instead, she spent 37 years in the insurance industry. Twenty of these were with Acadia, a

Maine-based commercial insurance company, where she became the regional vice president for the New Hampshire office and the chief underwriting officer for the entire company, both firsts for a woman.

As a "first woman," she says she "understands how important it is for other women to have mentors and advocates. She also points out that being "first" in any field can be "isolating," and underscores the role of AAUW as an advocate for women.

In addition to stepping outside her educational field, she says, "I'm an outlier in my family." Her husband of 38 years was a teacher, her daughter is a high school principal, and her sister was a university professor.

Like many of us, her introduction to Venice branch was through a friend, in this case Pat Weber. They met initially at Jacaranda Country Club, where both couples are members.

Her move to Venice was also prompted by a suggestion of a friend who had migrated here from New Hampshire. "We spent two days in Venice and I was convinced that this was the place." She found its smaller size and vibrant downtown "more like the New England towns we were used to."

In this era of "zooming" instead of meeting in person, look for Bobbi when we congregate around our computers, knowing our treasury is in very knowledgeable hands.

ZOOM TIPS & REMINDERS

Like hundreds of organizations, AAUW is ZOOMNG to stay connected. Members are finding that the "face-to-face" quality of this virtual meeting platform helps us grow better acquainted. It's like being invited into someone's home! And, like strong, educated women, we all are learning to turn challenges into opportunities. This article is intended to help those 'late adopters' forge forward, and the 'new embracers' pick up a new tip.

Not a ZOOM member? Visit www.zoom.us and register for free. Upload a mug shot and save the name you want people to see. Watch a "getting started" tutorial and check out tips! Ready for advanced work? You can plan your visual staging by following these five steps: 1. zoom.us/sign 2. Personal Meeting Room 3. Start Meeting 4. Open Zoom Meeting -- Watch for an email from Venice AAUW within 12–48 hours of any event with the Zoom "invitation" and the link which you will use to connect. 5. Start Video. You are all alone, so have fun experimenting with lighting and backdrops! Hint: It's OK to move the computer out of the kitchen office or your desk in the bedroom.

General Guidelines:

DO:

- Use a computer with a larger screen and built-in camera if possible. iPads and cell phones will work, but they are less effective in terms of tools and options to see everyone.
- Plan a setting that puts a source of light in front of you (not to the side or behind you) to avoid shadows on your face.
- Dress as you would for a face-to-face event; It is a small step toward normalcy!
- Join early (10-15 minutes before the start of an event) to conquer any technical glitch or enjoy chatting.

DON'T:

- Leave your microphone on and make noise; even coughs trigger interruptions.
- Move too close to the camera when speaking; it's like violating personal space.
- Talk over others; learn to use the chat room.
- Let the ceiling be part of your background, *especially ceiling fans*.
- Move in and out of the setting without first turning off your video.

<u>Tips from the Pros</u> (think morning talk show host broadcasting from home):

Plan a background that shows some personality; Raise your computer so the camera is at eye level; Allow your torso and face to fill the scene; Assume good posture; Have what you may need within arm's reach; Try looking at the camera!

Finally, if you are having challenges with ZOOM, please reach out for one-on-one assistance! We are here to help you and we all want to see **you**!!

NOVEMBER 12, 2020 GENERAL MEETING REVIEW

Ashley Brown, CEO and Executive Director of the Women's Resource Center (WRC) of Sarasota and Manatee Counties, joined us via Zoom to share her organization's scope and impact. Like almost every organization, she and her staff needed to reimagine themselves in March 2020. Within 5 days after shut-down, they were able to field calls from home and continue their mission of enabling and empowering women of all ages to be self-sufficient.

Data shared by Ashley revealed that, between March 23 and September 30, the WRC conducted nearly 4,000 remote appointments and directed nearly 9,000 individuals to resources, almost doubling the numbers in the same period in 2019. Services span emotional support, financial and legal resources, support groups, career counseling, and much more.

For clients in need of suitable attire for interview or the workplace, WTC offers a free "Career Closet" with gently used, donated clothing. Donations are accepted Wednesdays at the WTC location in BrickYard Plaza.

During her presentation, Ashley stressed that every woman has been through transitions, and our ability to survive and move forward has much to do with resiliency. Please take a moment to consider how this relates to your formative years. How did you accomplish your goals? Who gave you hope? What bolstered you in the tough times?

SARASOTA BRANCH RELEASES RESEARCH STUDY

In October, the AAUW Sarasota Branch released a new research study, *Aging, Women and Economic Insecurity in Sarasota County, Florida* conducted by Mary Gatta, PhD and Jessica Horning, MSSW. One notable finding is; "In the County, women reported a medium retirement income of \$13,792; men had \$24,289 - a gap of 57 percent." AAUW Sarasota recommends policies targeted to seniors to address these gaps. 
