When she sits down at the piano at one of our gatherings, she's ready to help us get right into a celebratory mood. Get to know her and she embodies the sentiment of these oft-quoted words: *Life is like a piano. What you get out it depends on how you play it.* And her life is an energetic composition of people, places and experiences.

This Iowa-born, Illinois-raised woman earned a degree at Northwestern University in music education with a double major in piano and voice. After two years teaching 5th grade and junior high music in Illinois, she moved to Washington state and another teaching post.

It's also where she met her husband, Samir, from Beirut, Lebanon, who was in the States earning a Ph.D. The marriage



took her to Beirut where she continued to teach, 6th graders at the American Community School and music education students at the Beirut College for Women.

Over the years, her husband's profession took them to Saudi Arabia, Libya, and Rome. His U.N.posting's diplomatic status meant she wasn't allowed to take a paid job. So she involved herself in the expat community through the U.N. Women's Guild, the American Women's Club of Rome and Welcome Neighbor. Along the way, she also learned French, Italian and "some Arabic."

She has two daughters, both born in Beirut. One of them is Samira Easton, who lives here in Venice and is also an AAUW member. Muna Strasser is a D.D.S. who lives in Moline, III.

In 1995, the Badawis retired to Falls Church, Va. where she immersed herself in volunteer activities and an arts group. They came to Venice as snowbirds, buying a home here in 2004. She then connected with Suncoast Duo Pianists, a performing group of retired professional pianists and Venice Musicale, which raises money for local area children studying music.

She's been a member of our branch for more than a decade, with our scholarship projects her main interest. She says, "I was helped in my educational life and this is something I can do to support scholarships for other women."
