Member Profile—Joy Mahler



You may not recognize her by sight as she has a "day job," president of an area Big Brothers Big Sisters, an organization she's been a part of for the past 39 years.

A Michigan native, she holds a degree in community consumer services from Michigan State University. A dean at MSU introduced her to field study in the juvenile division of probate court. It was in the intake division, a place "where the door locks after you." That was what launched her into advocacy as a "friend of the court."

After graduation, she worked in support enforcement and mediation in the Lansing area, then moved briefly with her husband to Arizona.

In 1982, the couple moved to Florida where his grandparents lived. Here she initially worked in a family business when she saw an advertisement for a part-time position with Big Brothers Big Sisters. The organization's service area was south Sarasota County when she was hired. In 1983, she became a full-time employee and eventually president of the non-profit, which had expanded to serve ten Florida counties.

Along the way, she did long distance postgraduate work in business executive management at Columbia University (NYC) and non-profit management at Duke University (NC).

The clients of Big Brothers Big Sisters are diverse, evenly split between boys and girls with nearly two-thirds minorities. She describes the goal of the organization and its volunteers are to "help young people ignite the power and promise of youth." She adds, "Youth achieve their potential with a caring and committed mentor". The organization focuses on the educational progress of youth supporting children from elementary and beyond high school to age 21.

Joy has four children of her own, two boys and two girls and a husband of 33 years.

Although she's usually too busy to attend monthly AAUW meetings, she has high regard for our support for education. "I really admire the scholarship program and the focus on empowering women", she says.

What's ahead for her? "I can't really think about retiring," she says. "There's too much to do. [Judith Houston]
