#### ART MAKES A HOUSE A HOME!

Nearly 20 members contributed artwork for Family Promise's new homes at the May 12 meeting. Dubbed "orphaned art," these pieces have either been in storage or simply no longer fit in the current interior of our homes. But, imagine not having <u>anything</u> for your walls – or any extra money to acquire some artwork!!

Backing up --- we learned in February about the mission of Family Promise of South Sarasota County: to reduce the impact of homelessness among children. Just this year, the organization was able to build homes for homeless parents with children as transitional residences while the families rebuild their livelihoods.

Along with AAUW donations, Gulf Breeze Art and Framing contributed 10 pieces of custom-framed artwork. The frame shop also donated supplies and labor to clean, rewire, and wrap all of the donations for transport. Essentially, Family Promise received 35 "like-new" framed artwork!!
