Jaso holds a Doctorate in Teaching and Learning with a concentration in American History. Her 18 years of teaching experience include Montessori, Gifted, Title I, and virtual learning. She is a state-wide leader in historical literacy and a founder of the Florida Council for History Education.

Scholarship and Tech Trek Update

The 2022 Non-Traditional Scholarship winners were celebrated on February 2nd at our AAUW meeting. Unfortunately, only Katie Cole was able to attend the reception in person, but Scena Shmucker sent a heartwarming video message. Scena also received a scholarship from AAUW in 2021. She is attending Galen College of Nursing and graduated in June 2022 as an RN. She is a Hospice nurse and is working towards her Bachelor's degree. In her message, she thanked AAUW for their support and remarked on what a positive impact our scholarship had on her and her family. Katie Cole, a single mother who escaped an abusive marriage, shared her story which was sad but also hopeful. Despite her significant health issues, she wants to continue her education to make a better life for her daughter and herself. Although I had hoped that the other recipients had attended or sent messages, I am confident that our scholarship had a positive impact on them as well.

Gulf Coast Community Foundation's scholarship site opened in early December and the application deadline is March 3, 2023. Our scholarship committee includes Marge Ostrom, Dottiev Bingman, Bobbie Amero and myself. GCCF will notify us when our applicants' documents are ready to be viewed. Interviews will be held, and the awardees will be chosen by June 2023.

Last year AAUW Venice chapter established the Pat Weber Scholarship at the University of South Florida. This scholarship is awarded yearly to a young woman interested in pursuing a career in the STEM field. Bobbi Amero and I will be meeting with Kaitlyn Kramer Reeves, the Associate Director of Development at USF to discuss future opportunities of involvement for our AAUW chapter.

For the first time since the Covid 19 pandemic, we have four Tech Trek applicants. Three have scheduled their interviews which will be completed by March 6th. Mary Fritz, Jean Norman and I look forward to meeting these young ladies. Our Venice chapter will pay \$1000 for each of them to attend the camp at either Stetson University held from June 11th to the 17th, or Florida Atlantic University in Jupiter held from June 18th to the 24th. One of our members has graciously agreed to pay each attendee's \$50 registration fee.

Member Profile—Nancy Brex

Nancy Brex, who is now one of the branch's three newsletter editors, grew up in Rhode Island and began her college studies at Connecticut College. When she became engaged to marry a man enrolled at Columbia, she completed her education degree at Barnard College in New York. She went on to acquire a master's degree at New York University.

After a brief stint at teaching, Nancy became a stay-at-home mom until the youngest of her three boys turned nine. It was then she began substitute teaching at a school with students from preschool to eighth grade. It was going to be a yearlong position; she wound up staying 24 years. For much of that career, she was the school's librarian which meant she interacted with students in all these grades. She also taught English and literature for grades six through eight.

While she was raising her children, she involved herself in a number of volunteer activities. "I like to write," she says. "I was an English major." She exercised that interest writing for her local Friends of the Library organization and a garden club.

Like many of us, Nancy and her husband chose Venice as a Florida base through a personal connection. She and Wendy Seeley (our branch education director) have been "best friends" since

eighth grade. After several visits here, the couple bought a home in Venice. They also have a part-time residence in the Berkshires in Massachusetts. Since joining our branch, she's enjoyed the boat captained by our president Paula Dulski and participating in the book group. Beyond the opportunities for personal enjoyment, she underscores her support for the branch mission. She says, "I'm impressed with all that's going on and our support for women's education."

At this time she is happily retired and occasionally volunteers for the Englewood Community Care Clinic which provides care to uninsured residents in Charlotte and Sarasota County.



Art in the Afternoon March 29 - 11:30am Downtown Venice Library


