Jan will draw upon current research and a variety of resources regarding the impact of Covid and social media specific to women. She hopes that

members will find this presentation to be interesting, interactive, and meaningful.

Sound a bit scholarly? Yes, Dr. Jan Harris is Professor Emeritus at Bridgewater State University in Massachusetts where she has taught for 40 years. She holds a Masters and PhD from Boston University and began her higher education at the University of Massachusetts/Amherst, earning a bachelor's degree in sociology.

She and her husband, Bob, have been married for 48 years and maintain a home in Nantucket. In 2009, they bought their first home in Venice. Shortly thereafter, while volunteering at the Venice Art Center, she met an AAUW member and immediately joined the branch. Jan has been active with home tours, scholarship fund-raising, and service as board secretary.

Jan is sincere and enthusiastic about AAUW, saying "I'm thrilled to be part of a vibrant group of women who are truly engaged in empowering other women!"

Together with Bev Weltzien, Jan will become part of the first-ever Venice branch Co-President team in the coming year!

Annual Dues For 2024


AAUW National dues for FY24 will be \$72.00 in accordance with the three-year increase implemented by the AAUW Board of Directors back in October 2020. This rate became effective in the system on April 1, 2023. This new rate applies to both new and renewing members. The Shape the Future discount of 50% off national dues when processing new members remains in effect.

Because of the increase in national dues, the total for Venice Branch membership will increase from \$98.00 to \$103.00 as of April 1, 2023. AAUW National will be sending out renewal notices. Members can renew online or can send a check for \$103.00 to: AAUW Venice, P.O. Box 515, Venice, FL 34284. Please keep in mind that newer members have a different renewal date as national instituted rolling renewal dates in FY 2023.


