Welcome to the 2023/24 membership year! Expect to see a Public Policy page in each *Venice Views* going forward, along with related programming. Our goal is to educate our membership on key issues affecting women in Venice, Sarasota County and Florida, with a call to

action. We'll offer ways big and small to get involved and be heard. JOIN US -- together we are stronger!
