Spotlight on Tech Trek - March 14 Program Highlights

Pam Swarts, our Program Director, introduced Carol Newman, a longtime Venice AAUW member, for the March program. Her passion for girls' exposure to STEM education (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) motivated her to help form the AAUW Florida Supporting Foundation, a 501(3)(c) organization that raises awareness and funds for two Tech Trek camps currently located at Florida Atlantic University in Juniper and Stetson University in Deland FL. After highlighting the subjects and experiences the girls had, Carol remarked, "I wish I could go to these camps, but I'm not qualified . . . I'm not a girl entering 8th grade!"

The day's highlight was hearing from Emily Nason, who was interviewed by Wendy Seeley, Education Director. Emily is an 8th grader at SKY Academy in Venice. She gave upbeat, positive replies to the challenging questions posed to her. To cap off Tech Trek's impression on these young women, Emily's father stood up to express thanks and stated how impactful the experience was for his daughter. She was one of 3 girls sponsored by Venice AAUW at the summer 2023



camp. Peyton Osmond and Mikayla Karrer, Venice Middle School students, were also selected.

Looking Ahead to Critical 2024 Votes: We Need You!

We all know this is a pivotal year for our national elections. Amid the intense media focus on the races for the Presidency and in Congress, be sure to keep crucial state and local elections on your calendars! So many key issues for women and Floridians are at an inflection point.

Here are a few:

Reproductive Rights Ballot

- Early April: Florida Supreme Court ruling on ballot language is due.
- Click here for an overview of the Court's role and its deliberations (from the NY Times).
- Once approved, FL Constitutional "Amendment 4" requires 60% voter assent to pass.
- October 7: Voter registration deadline for General Election.
- November 5: General Election, incl. State ballot initiatives. TURNOUT IS ESSENTIAL!

Sarasota School Board & Hospital Board Elections

- Here's a golden opportunity to support public education and healthcare, and ensure that candidates with deep professional experience in these fields are elected.
- <u>July 22</u>: Voter registration deadline.
- August 20: Election Day School Board (two seats) & Hospital Board (four seats)
- EVERY VOTE COUNTS! This is NOT a primary!
- Full election information for Sarasota County is available here, and Charlotte County here.

- March saw welcome signs of moderation in "culture wars" in several school board elections. Focus is shifting to academics and security. Read about recent trends here.
- Book bans appear to be losing steam: View this TERRIFIC spotlight by 60 Minutes here.


