Volunteer needs include:

1. Sarasota Career Closet –

Assist clients in shopping in the closet, receive donations, and help keep the closet organized and looking its best.

2. Clothing Transporter – Volunteers needed to help transport clothing from the Venice office to the Sarasota office.
