#### **Membership Vote Outcome**

The 2024 AAUW election is now complete and we are grateful for all those who took the time to vote to change the requirements of membership to include non-degreed individuals. The initiative to open AAUW's membership did not pass. Therefore, it will remain as is.

Changes to AAUW's bylaws require 2/3 majority (66.6%) to pass. AAUW members voted 65.1% to approve the measure, just shy of passing.

We understand that this outcome may feel exclusionary to some. But AAUW's history is one of continual change and growth, even in the face of challenges. That same resilient spirit must guide us now as we seek to fulfill AAUW's purpose to advance equity for women and girls.

There are many ways to engage with AAUW and support our mission beyond membership. Please encourage your fellow members and non-members alike to engage with us—to become <a href="Two-Minute Activists">Two-Minute Activists</a>, to attend our webinars and events, to apply for a fellowship or grant, and to share the information and resources from our <a href="website">website</a>, which support women's economic empowerment.

## **National Grants for Graduate Level Degrees**

In April AAUW awarded \$6.25 million to 260 exceptional fellows and grantees to achieve their graduate level and professional goals or lead community-based projects that empower women and girls. AAUW is the oldest non-institutional funder of graduate-level women. The Venice branch has three funds at National that support these awards: Venice (FL) Branch, Francis T. Bourne and the American Fellowship.

# Vote!

Debbie Blackwell, Public Policy Director, is urging us to:

Mark YOUR calendars for August 20, 2024, as it's not just a Primary but a crucial election for the School Board and Hospital Board members in Sarasota County. This is your chance to make a difference, as everyone can vote for these significant positions.

#### November 5, 2024, on the Florida State ballot:

Floridians will vote on Amendment 1 to the State Constitution. If passed by 60% of the voters, **it would require district school board elections to be partisan**. Future ballots would list each candidate's political party. School board elections would become part of Florida's <u>closed primary system</u>.

Arguments for school boards to remain nonpartisan (A "NO" vote on Amendment 1): \*All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, can vote in nonpartisan elections.

Nearly 4,000,000 NPA voters in Florida would be excluded from voting for school board candidates in primaries if school board elections become partisan. In some circumstances, **only voters of one party would have a say in selecting candidates.**

Interviews were held at the Jacaranda Public Library with the students and their parents. Rating these seven young women was challenging as each of them would be an exceptional Tech Trek participant. For the first time, there were more applicants than available spots. Six of the Venice applicants were selected for the camps, with one on the Wait List. Each excelled in math and sciences, all of them had dreams for their futures, and for some, the Tech Trek Camp would be a life-changing experience. ## Women's Resource Center Update

The Women's Resource Center has two volunteer opportunities in the Venice office. The roles and descriptions are below. If any members are interested in volunteering for these duties, please get in touch with Nervely Sainvil, the Client Services Coordinator, at nsainvil@wrc.org. She will provide further instructions on how to proceed.

- **1. Digital Navigator**—Digital Technology has become one of the most widely used methods of communication. However, access to the Internet, devices, and computer skills are wide and varied. Digital Navigators help clients with 1:1 computer tutoring, navigate affordable internet options, and find affordable devices. NO ADVANCED COMPUTER SKILLS ARE NECESSARY.
- **2. Clothing Transporter** Clothing transporters help transport donated clothing from our Venice office to our Sarasota office.

In addition to these volunteer opportunities, we have decided to support the Women's Resource Center with clothing drives at two of our monthly meetings next year. These drives are a vital part of our support for the center. The first one will be held in November, and the second will be held at one of the spring meetings. As you change your wardrobe for the seasons or clean out closets, be sure to think about donating your unwanted clothing to this great organization.

The WRC accepts a wide range of women's clothing, shoes, and accessories in good condition. This includes scrubs, formal wear, coats, hats, scarves, purses, and jewelry. Clothing does not need to be only work attire. Slacks, sweaters, blouses, etc. are all welcome. The WRC also uses donations to supply their Unique Boutique in Bradenton. The Unique Boutique of the Women's Resource Center is an upscale resale boutique offering gently worn, brand-name women's clothing and accessories at reasonable prices. Sales at the boutique are used to help fund the programs offered at the WRC. The WRC also welcomes any reusable bags you don't need to help individuals carry their new items.

Once the number of members playing has been determined, a meeting place will be decided and Marge will let you know.


