# Dr. Aly Busse, Education Director of the Mote Marine Laboratory, speaks at the November Branch Meeting



At the November Branch meeting members were treated to a presentation by Dr. Aly Busse about the Mote Marine Laboratory education programs and new aquarium. As an education director, Dr. Busse has been at Mote since 2011, developing an extensive program reaching all ages nicknamed SEA for Science Education Aquarium. She outlined many of the programs for all ages beginning with kindergarten, including high school volunteers from 3 Sarasota high schools, internships at the undergrad and gradate university levels, post-doc research and lifelong learning programs for adults. Of special interest to many is their work with girls encouraging careers in STEM. Dr. Busse ended her presentation with an overview of the new Mote Science Education Aquarium (Mote SEA) located just off I 75 in Sarasota slated to open early 2025. She quoted Leila Janah: "Talent is equally distributed, opportunity is not."

### A LETTER TO THE PRESIDENT OF OUR COUNTRY

Our country faces a critical issue, and Debbie Blackwell, Public Policy Director, asks us to send a letter to the President. Let's see how we can make a difference.

The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) would quarantee that all men and women are truly equal under the law and that these rights cannot easily be abridged.

The AAUW Public Policy Priorities, voted on by members every two years, guide all AAUW public policy actions. Below is a sample letter you might consider sending.

President Biden at the Whitehouse

1600 Pennsylvania Avenue N.W.

Washington, DC 20500.

Dear President Biden,

I urge you to direct the US Archivist to certify the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), adding sex and gender equality to the Constitution once and for all. The final publication of the ERA is within your power, and it is time to secure your legacy.

I appreciate your years of commitment to the fight for gender equality, including your legacy of authoring the Violence Against Women Act, as well as your Administration's work to address gender-based violence and defend and expand reproductive rights and healthcare access. In recent years, we have seen how quickly our rights can be stripped away and our nation's progress overturned. We cannot take a single liberty for granted and cannot wait to take this vital step.

Your White House has repeatedly spoken about enshrining the principle of gender equality in our Constitution. Mr. President, you have that power. In your remaining time in office, I implore you to instruct the Archivist to certify the Equal Rights Amendment and unequivocally define your legacy as a lifelong champion for equal rights.

The future of our democracy depends on it.



Location: The United Church of Christ - 620 Shamrock Rd, Venice, FL

The meeting was called to order following a welcome back greeting by the co-president, Beverly Weltzien. A program by Dr. Aly Busse, education director of Mote Marine and Aquarium, was introduced by Lynda Weston, our newly appointed Program Director.

Jan Harris, Co-President, offered a Civility Moment, which will become a staple of our meetings going forward.

Debbie Blackwell encouraged members to write a brief note to President Biden to instruct the Archivist to certify the Equal Rights Amendment. Forty cards were signed and posted.

The meeting was called to order with the announcement of the minutes and Treasurer's reports being posted and approved on our website. There is \$51,657.82 in the VAAUW account and approximately \$24,000 in the Gulf Coast Foundation Account.

Judy Napier of the Membership Committee introduced new members and guests. She presented Trena Kelly with a 50-Year Award as an AAUW member.
