Virtual Reality Supports Youth Inquiry at USF

Our January AAUW program was presented by Dr. Cheryl Ellerbrock, University of South Florida Sarasota-Manatee College of Education Dean. Dr. Ellerbrock shared videos of the University's new innovative program called "World of Wonder" and wonder is what those in attendance felt as the professor of middle grades and general secondary education explained the new STEM focused program the preservice and graduate students are experiencing. We saw drones and robots that are available in a few schools in Sarasota. Ellerbrock described ways Virtual Reality, and games in general, require students to be curious, move and collaborate. Enrollment in the department of education is however down. The Dean spoke of community outreach finding willing partners to fund many of these new programs and scholarships to support enrollees financially and to attract college students into education. We hope to connect again with Dr. Ellerbrock.

AAUW VENICE SCHOLARSHIP RECEPTION

Members of the AAUW came to the Venezia Hotel on January 15th to honor the 2024 Scholarship Recipients. Four women were awarded the branch's Nontraditional Scholarship, and each received \$3000 towards tuition expenses. To qualify for this unique scholarship, the woman must be a resident of Sarasota County, at least 21 years old, provide proof of application enrollment of higher education in a certificate or undergraduate degree program, and most importantly, have had an interruption of 12 months or more in her continuing education.

- Paige Kinney attends Galen College of Nursing and hopes to become a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. She is married with two children and lives in North Port.
- Ashlee Komor is enrolled in the Nursing Program at Capella University and hopes to become an ER nurse. As a teenage mom, Ashlee put her education on hold and worked for 20 years in a pediatric office. When the doctor retired, she knew it was time for her to pursue her goals.
- AnnMarie Medico, also a 2023 scholarship recipient, is enrolled in the Nursing Program at Rasmussen College, and hopes to become a pediatric nurse.
- Angela Miller, who attends the University of South Florida, is pursuing a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Interdisciplinary Social Sciences. She will graduate this spring and has been offered a Research Assistant position for the coming year.

In 2022, our Venice branch partnered with the University of South Florida to establish the AAUW Venice Scholarship, named for Pat Weber, a "STEM" pioneer for young girls. Venice AAUW decided to honor Pat, who died in 2021, for all her efforts. This scholarship is awarded annually to a female student, attending USF with the intent of pursuing a degree in the STEM field. This year the award went to two young women, Phoebe Almero and Yasmin Mezroub.

- Phoebe Almero is a senior with a major in Biomedical Studies. She plans to attend an optometry school with hopes of specializing in pediatric primary eye care.
- Yasmin Mezroub is a sophomore with a major in Health Sciences. She is deeply appreciative of the financial assistance.
