Journalist Carrie Siedman Spoke at our March Program



We had the pleasure of hearing Carrie Siedman, former journalist for the *Sarasota Herald Tribune*, speak on March 13th. Carrie and Program Director Lynda Weston engaged in a lively Q&A covering Carrie's past and current engagement with many issues. The first one she discussed was her involvement with issues regarding mental health. On many occasions this was a topic for Carrie in her writing. She has written a performance piece on the topic which will be performed April 26 at 3 and 7 at Sarasota Contemporary Dance in the Rosemary District. Carrie also discussed the Sarasota County Commissioners with perhaps some steps forward, but a few in the other direction regarding development and what seems like a conflict of interest between the board member and the building trade. The school board has calmed down with some changes of board members.

She gave some personal examples of exclusions due to being a female early in her career and then not feeling she had been given a fair chance at the other end, which could have been seen as equity issue. A question was asked regarding "freedom of the press" and the recent ousting of the AP from the White House and Air Force One. With so many avenues to get news, Carrie said that we need journalists now more than ever. She urged the membership to stay involved.

Carrie is currently out of her condo due to the hurricane floods of last fall. She hopes to return to her home in the next few months.


