AAUW Membership “Mentor” Guidelines

Rationale:

Mentoring seems to be a beneficial role to play in the critical early stages of AAUW Venice membership. This would be a volunteer, one on one relationship with a “seasoned” AAUW member and a new AAUW member. This volunteer role would closely align with the major goal of the Venice AAUW Chapter which is to “engage” all members, new and seasoned.

Role Description and suggested guidelines:

A mentor in this role would be paired with a new member by the Membership Chair, unless the member requests a specific member with whom to be paired.

- Members who volunteer to serve as a Mentor to a new member would take on this role for the 1st year of the new member’s membership.
- Mentors would begin their role by contacting the new member prior to the monthly meetings. Contact can be via phone, text, email, or in person.
- Mentors should engage the new member in conversation if possible regarding highlights of the upcoming season, year, and answer questions the new member may have.
- If at all possible, mentors should volunteer to sit with or accompany the new member to meetings, especially early in the season.
- Mentors should highlight for the new members SIG activities, in particular ones with which they are familiar and in which they participate.

- Mentors should keep in touch with the Membership Chair to let her know any issue, concerns, or just to let her know all is well with the Mentoring.
- Mentors and Mentees will be recognized in some manner by the Membership chair at the end of the season.

AAUW Membership Dues

Everything you wanted to know about dues but were afraid to ask:

- Dues are entirely tax deductible. You are paying a combination of the National, Florida, and Venice Branch dues.
- Beginning April 1, 2025 the dues are \$105. The price combines the National [\$74], State [\$12], and Branch [\$19] dues.
- Beginning April 1, 2026 the dues will be \$107.
- The due dates are variable. You should get reminders from National and quite possibly a nudge from Paula Dulski.
- The national database lists your membership status as 'Current', 'Grace', and 'Expired'. Please try to stay current. Paula has your due date.
- Credit Card payments: You can go online to the National Website at my.aauw.org. The National organization will send the \$19 branch dues to bank account.
- Or Pay by Check: Send your payment to P.O.Box 515, Venice, FL 34284. The payee is AAUW Venice. National collects their dues and the Florida dues from our bank account.

2025 AAUW Venice Scholarship Awards

Working with the Gulf Coast Community Foundation the Venice branch was able to award scholarships to four Sarasota County women: Karla King, Paige Kinney, Natasha Kozel, and Brianna Whaley.

Karla King, a full-time psychology student at University of South Florida is pursuing a bachelor's degree with a focus on children's behavioral health. As a single mother, balancing her education has required resilience and creativity.

Paige Kinney is a second-year recipient of the Venice Scholarship and graduated on October 27th as a Registered Nurse from Galen College of Nursing. She is continuing her education to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, and her goal is to become a Certified Register Nurse Anesthetist. She is a mother of two who has lived with cystic fibrosis, a lifelong genetic disorder. When a life-changing medication became available a few years ago, she enrolled in the nursing program and is achieving her lifetime dream.

Natasha Kozel, who was born and raised in Thailand, attends State College of Florida, and is pursuing a nursing degree. She believes her compassion for others, her commitment to helping people, and her drive to make a difference makes nursing a perfect fit for her.

Brianna Whaley, who works full time as a vet tech, enrolled in the surgical technology program at Southern Technical College. Her dream is to be part of a surgical team which will give her the chance to directly impact people's lives and help them during some of their most vulnerable moments.

A few years ago, Venice AAUW established a scholarship at University of Southern Florida to honor Pat Weber. Pat, a longtime member had a significant impact encouraging young women to pursue STEM careers. Each year, USF personnel choose deserving women for this scholarship. This year's recipients are Katarzyna Goralczk and Sophia Dolamanet. Katarzyna, born in Poland, emigrated to the US as a child, when her father won the Green Card lottery. She is a first-year student pursuing a nursing degree. Sophia is a biomedical science major, who is studying to become a doctor.

This past summer, our branch established an additional scholarship at University of South Florida, and Gia Goldflam received this award. She is pursuing a degree in psychology, with a minor in criminology, and plans to become a criminal psychologist.

AAUW's mission is to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education and research. Our Venice branch has provided these women a second chance and the opportunity to achieve their career goals.
